DON BALDRIDGE ELECTED CHAIRMAN OF THE TEXAS PIPELINE ASSOCIATION

AUSTIN, Texas [Jan. 14, 2019] – Don Baldrige, president of commercial for DCP Midstream, has been elected chairman of the Texas Pipeline Association (TPA). TPA is the largest state trade association in the country that solely represents the interests of the intrastate pipeline network. The association formally made the announcement last Friday at its annual meeting, held at the Hilton DoubleTree Hotel in downtown Houston.

Baldrige has more than 20 years of experience in the energy industry, including commercial, trading and business development activities. In his current role, he is responsible for all commercial activity for gathering and processing and natural gas liquids (NGL) logistics, as well as origination, business development, optimization, contract administration, gas control, and marketing and trading. Previously, Baldrige was president of the marketing and logistics business unit for DCP Midstream, responsible for NGLs and natural gas pipeline and storage assets, as well as marketing and trading activities. Prior to that, he was vice president of business development of DCP Midstream, responsible for business development and corporate development activities coordinated with DCP Midstream Partners. He began his career with the company in 2005 as director of corporate development managing acquisition evaluation and negotiations for multiple midstream acquisition opportunities. He holds a bachelor’s degree in economics from the University of Virginia and a master’s in business administration from the University of Denver.

“The staff and membership of TPA has established a strong reputation of collaboration, safety, and advocacy, and I am proud to serve such a remarkable organization through this role,” said Baldrige.
